Janet Edmonds – Adventures with Stitch inspired by Hundertwasser

Janet Edmonds is a freelance textile artist, author of several books and experienced tutor, exhibiting and delivering courses to adults nationally and internationally. She has taught C & G courses for 25 years at various centres including Missenden Abbey and also runs advanced workshops. She was awarded the Medal for Excellence and the Broderers Prize in 2016

Hundertwasser was an Austrian artist with a strong individual style. We will use his love of bright, intense colour and quirky imagery of lines spirals and eyes meandering around organic shapes together with an imaginary walk through familiar places to create a spontaneous design.

This will be turned into a small piece of stitching with raised areas.



Requirements List

A3 cartridge paper, acrylic paints, palette and water pot, variety of brushes (not small and fine), caron d'ache crayons, or something similar (not coloured pencils).

Paper scissors, masking tape, roll kitchen paper, gloves and apron.

Small pieces of fabric in Hundertwasser's colours, bright primary reds, yellows, purple, blue and green.

Piece of calico/cotton for background, embroidery hoop if wished.

A collection of threads in bright colours including black or darks. Small piece of felt for padding
